Key stage 1-2 all pupils made expected or better progress in English and Maths, no pupils were disadvantaged

Key stage 2-3 all pupils made expected or better progress in Maths, 50% of pupils made expected or better progress in English.

Key stage 3-4 all pupils made expected or better progress in both English and Maths Pupils at the end of key stage 4 all pupils attained an external accreditation in core subjects and a range of accredited vocational subjects.
