School evaluates progress and attainment of pupils in the September each year, data 2013' shows that:

Key stage 1-2 all vulnerable pupils made expected or better progress in English and Maths.
Key stage 2-3 all vulnerable pupils made expected or better progress in English and Maths.

Key stage 3-4 All vulnerable pupils made expected or better progress in English and Maths in year7, in years 8 &9 1 out of 9 vulnerable pupils did not make expected progress, in English 3/10 vulnerable pupils did not make expected progress,

Pupils at the end of key stage 4 all vulnerable pupils attained an external accreditation in core subjects and a range of accredited vocational subjects.

Summary of PPG spending 2012/13

Objectives in spending PPG:

A: To ensure families of vulnerable pupils are supported both academically and socially

B: To support individual pupils and families where a specific individual need is identified

Summary of spending and actions taken:

A: Joint appointment with another special school of a family outreach co-ordinator (FOC)

B: Teacher appointed to work with individual pupils and small groups whom Data identified as in need of academic interventions.

B: Additional Learning mentor time purchased to support individuals and small groups who required emotional support

B: Escort provided on transport to support an individual with behaviour management

B: Additional TA support for EYFS pupils to meet additional personal needs.

B: 1 Day share of additional Speech Therapy to support implementation of specialist SCERTS programme.

B: Breakfast club provided.

B: provision of training for Voluntary examination readers.

B: Provision of Summer residential.

Outcomes to date:**A**

- FOC has raised £2,930.52 this financial year through fundraising events.
- FOC has supported 71 families with benefits applications and mediation support
- FOC has developed a programme of family learning in school
- FOC has introduced and developed a key stage 3 Duke of Edinburgh scheme

B

- An experienced primary practitioner scrutinizes data termly and identifies pupils requiring specific interventions in individual strands of English & maths and works with these pupils for half a term
- Learning mentor has supported primary and secondary pupils with curriculum engagement.
- A pupil with behavioural difficulties was supported whilst on school transport.
- EYFS pupils requiring additional levels of personal care and assistance with feeding are supported
- Pupils with complex communication difficulties are supported by a specialist educational speech therapy programme
- Breakfast is provided to all pupils requiring food to enable curriculum engagement
- Examination access is enhanced
