Parent/Carer Survey Feedback – February 2024:

Thank you to all those parents/carers who responded to the survey that was sent out in February. These surveys really help us to identify your priorities for our Careers and Preparing for Adulthood programme and means that we can make changes that reflect the needs of our young people and their families.

The results of the survey showed that:

Strengths of Provision

- Community Inclusion: Parents/carers recognise that there are many opportunities being offered to our young people in order to support them to develop the confidence, skills and awareness needed to access their local community.
- + Communication: Parents/carers appreciate the effort that is being made to share information, feedback and photographs of the careers-related activities that are taking place in school thorough the website, Class Dojo and termly Careers newsletter.
- Named Careers Lead: Parents/carers are now recognising that there is a named person who can support them with their concerns, questions or queries.

Areas for Improvement

- Work Experience: Whilst parents/carers appreciate the breadth of opportunities that are being offered, a suggested area for improvement is refining work experience so that students are matched with opportunities that are more closely linked to their personal interests and aspirations.
- Transition to Adult Services:
 Parents/carers find this transition particularly daunting and confusing so it would be beneficial to develop relationships with this team and increase their presence within school to enable parents/carers to make informed decisions.
- Travel Training: Parents/carers are keen to see more travel training opportunities embedded within the curriculum. This is not currently offered by Dudley so alternative options are being explored.

We will continue to develop our provision in line with your feedback over the next academic year.

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Reviewing our Year:



Hippodrome Education Network:

This year, we have partnered with Birmingham Hippodrome and this allowed every class in school to experience creative drama sessions with Sam, our learning and participation artist.

Employer Project - Scarecrow Festival:

This year, we continued to develop our partnership with Forge Mill Farm by joining in with their Scarecrow Festival that ran over the Whitsun holidays. Pupils from Badger, Pathway 2, Amethyst and Emerald all made a fantastic scarecrow based on the theme of 'tradition and culture'.

Pupil Feedback:

'Our Scarecrow was called Morris. He was a Morris dancer. That's a May Day tradition' — Emerald Class





Employer Project - Midland Metro Alliance:

This year, pupils from Amethyst, Emerald and Pathway 1 also produced some amazing Bug Hotels for Midland Metro. Winners were chosen from each class and these were sent to Midland Metro so that they could be used to provide a safe haven for wildlife in amongst all of the construction work being done!

Pupil Feedback:

'We liked it when Tom and Tim (from MMA) came to visit. We got to talk to them about our ideas' – Pathway 1

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Reviewing our Year:

Work-Related Learning at Forge Mill Farm:

Pupils from Pathway 2, 3 and 4 have completed two blocks of work-related learning at Forge Mill Farm. They have carried out a wide range of jobs on the farm including showing visitors round and taking part in lambing!

Pupil Feedback:

'I don't want to work on a farm in the future but this was still good experience because I had to work in a team, follow instructions and follow health and safety' – Pathway 4 Pupil

Pupils from Pathway 1, Amethyst and Emerald have completed two blocks of work-related learning at Forge Mill Farm. This has helped them to understand how the farm changes with the seasons.

Work-Related Learning at Riverside House:

Amethyst, Emerald and Post 16 have continued to attend Riverside House this year, where they have worked hard to contribute positively to the conservation work that is taking place.

DPD Sensory Sessions:

Ruby Class, Amethyst, Emerald and Pathway 1 also experienced sensory-based sessions with DPD. This was an opportunity for them to explore the sights, sounds and processes associated with delivering a parcel. Students also had the opportunity to practice using the hand-held computers and dress up in DPD uniforms.

Community Engagement:

This year, Halesbury School has continued to have a visible presence within the local community with students frequently accessing facilities such as cafes, parks, libraries and leisure centres. Some groups have also carried out charity work and visits to a local care home in order to make a positive contribution to the community.

PFA Day

All Secondary-aged pupils will continue to access a range of work-based learning opportunities, employer engagement projects and community-based activities in order to support them in Preparation for Adulthood.

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Dudley HAF:

Dudley Holiday Activity Fund (HAF) provides free school holiday activities for children aged 5-16 who are eligible for Free School Meals. Some activities are also funded for children and young people aged 5-19 who do not receive Free School Meals but do have an Education, Health and Care Plan, however, due to overall capacity of the programme, these places are limited and not guaranteed.



HAF activities will be available to book very soon (expected mid-late June). In order to access the booking site, you will need to be registered with HAF so that a personalized booking link can be sent to you.

To register, you need to register using the following link: https://register.bookinglab.co.uk/dudley/37001/register If you are not Free School Meals, you will be asked to name a professional who can verify your child's needs — this can be a member of staff from within school e.g. class teacher, member of family support etc. or an external agency such as GP, family support worker etc.
